Prayer... with God's power !

Begin by listing and praying for a few neighbors, co-workers or classmates. People you know or see! You may choose to ask a Christian friend or your spouse to pray with you.

Make a simple map (with names) of your neighborhood, workplace or classroom. Pray for those people by name as the Lord leads you.

Then begin to **“walk and pray”** your neighborhood, your school or your work place (prayer walking). Or pray around your map and “let your fingers do the walking.”

Pray regularly and continue to add information (such as children's names, interests, needs, etc.) to your prayer map. A reminder such as an electric candle in your window or a lighthouse on your desk can help you to remember to pray for those the Lord has placed on your heart.

“Pray much for others, plead for God's mercy upon them...for He longs for all to be saved...” I Timothy 2:1,4

Care... with God's love !

Be friendly! Greet your neighbors, co-workers or classmates whenever you see them. Put love into action! (I John 3:18) Cultivate friendliness! Many are very lonely - your smile or wave may be their only friendly contact for the day or week.

Be ready to listen, people need to know that you care. Listen and watch for needs. If appropriate, let them know that you are praying for them.

Build relationships by allowing time to be where others are. Do your yard work while neighbors are outside, get your mail when others do, etc.

Be quick to **reach out with “random acts of kindness.”** Pick up trash on your neighbors' lawn, put their paper by their door, offer a co-worker a cup of coffee or loan paper or a pencil to a fellow student. Whatever you see to do, do it!

Build a reputation - take some cookies or a small gift to welcome new neighbors, co-workers or classmates. Introduce new people to others - be the “friendship committee.”

Share... with God's grace !

Let God use you! Invite a neighbor in. Share your home, office or school space freely.

Plan simple times. Host a shower, coffee or tea time. Share a treat at a restaurant. Have a brief prayer of thanks - for the food and for your friend.

Seek opportunities to share your faith. A current event, Christian book, television or radio program can open the door to spiritual topics.

Be an inviter! Take your friend to a Christian retreat or luncheon, a Bible Study, or a church outreach or crusade. Help them to hear the good news of Christ's love for them.

Share God's Word. Make God's promises clear with a simple devotional, a scripture verse that speaks to their particular need, a helpful tape or a Jesus video, an appropriate tract, or a Bible.

Share your personal testimony as God gives you the opportunity. Let the Lord's light in your life shine freely so that He may draw people to Himself!
