Mission America Coalition Carries On Lausanne Vision From Cape Town 2010 to LOVE 2020

The goal of the Cape Town 2010 Congress was *“To bring a fresh challenge to the global Church, to bear witness to Jesus Christ and all his teaching — in every nation, in every sphere of society, and in the realm of ideas.”*

— The Cape Town Commitment

As the US Lausanne Committee, the Mission America Coalition is grateful to be a part of the International Lausanne Movement that hosted the Cape Town 2010 Congress in South Africa.

About 4,200 Christian leaders representing 198 nations of the world gathered for the Congress. Several thousand more participated in the Congress through the Cape Town GlobalLink, Cape Town Virtual Congress, and the Lausanne Global Conversation online. Cape Town 2010 provided a re-focused emphasis on evangelism and the integral mission of the Church; called the Church back to humility, integrity and simplicity; and offered an earnest challenge to new collaborative initiatives and partnerships addressing the important issues facing the Church and God's world.

Following the Cape Town Congress in Fall 2010, the Mission America Coalition hosted Orlando 2011 the next Spring — the Annual Gathering of the Mission America Coalition. Flowing out of the historic Cape Town gathering, our focus was upon how we can share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in deed and word with every possible person in the United States and beyond. That has been the purpose and focus of the Mission America Coalition since our inception.

Continuing the momentum, the Mission America Coalition is planning the next gathering of the U.S. Lausanne Movement for 2012, bringing leaders in evangelism together to continue the vision to obey the Great Commandment and fulfill the Great Commission in this generation. Read about the new LOVE 2020 movement on page 8 — a move to share the love of Christ with every man, woman, young person, and child in the U.S. by the year 2020.

Mission America Coalition Flows from the Lausanne Movement

The U.S. Lausanne Committee was formed in 1989 but adopted the name of Mission America Coalition in 1993 as a way of emphasizing both its purpose — the Great Commission — and its scope — America and beyond. In the summer of 1974, Billy Graham convened Christian leaders from around the world to a congress on world evangelism in Lausanne, Switzerland. It was an historic meeting and the start of an international movement which became known as the Lausanne Movement. A second Lausanne Congress took place in Manila in 1989, where the U.S. Lausanne Committee was formed. The third Lausanne Congress took place in Cape Town, South Africa, in 2010, possibly the most representative gathering of Christian leaders in the 2000-year history of the Church. Mission America Coalition CEO and Chairman Paul Cedar and Vice-Chairman Lon Allison, along with half a dozen MAC National Facilitators played key roles in the Congress, as well as scores of MAC partners and members who participated as well. The Cape Town Commitment, issued from the 2010 gathering, serves as the road map for The Lausanne Movement for the coming decade.





God at Work through Orlando 2011

The Orlando Opening Session—A Plenary of Prayer

It was a wonderful sight—all 700 participants at the Orlando Mission America Coalition Conference praying in one accord! The entire first plenary session was given to prayer; no plenary speaker, but a plenary cry out to God. To help us pray in unity, segments of Dr. Chris Wright’s powerful message on confronting idols (originally presented at Cape Town 2010) were shown. This helped tie this Orlando event to the October Lausanne III meetings, and his concluding remark that there is “no biblical mission without biblical living” hit home. We took time around our tables to confront specific idols within the Church culture. It was evident that God heard our prayers. There was repentance. There was joy. There was common purpose. There was a sense of God’s presence.

Empowering Young Leaders through The Lausanne Movement

Cape Town 2010 was unique in its representation of younger leaders—about 40 percent of all participants were under the age of 40. This was an intentional inclusion of a new generation of leaders, to bring new voices to the table, and also the acknowledgement of the importance of empowering this generation to help carry the work forward. Younger leaders continue to become involved in The Lausanne Movement on many different levels. At the Orlando 2011 Younger Leaders Forum, some themes that clearly emerged were that younger leaders wanted opportunities to serve and lead and that they appreciated and longed for mentoring from experienced leaders. As the Movement continues to mobilize new leaders, each region of the world will host Younger Leaders Gatherings in the next two years. The North American Young Leaders Gathering (including Canada and the U.S.) will be hosted the summer of 2012.

National Association of Evangelicals Speaks for Millions

Awakening America Alliance Issues a Wake-Up Call to the Church



The Awakening America Alliance provides a broad umbrella under which the body of Christ in America can unite in seeking a contemporary spiritual awakening. It exists to issue a wake-up call for revival in the Church and a Christ-awakening in the nation. The Alliance collaborates in prayer, fasting, and God-inspired action to impact the nation's non-Christian population, and challenges today's Church in welcoming and discipling new generations of American youth.

National Prayer Committee Fosters United Prayer Initiatives



Centered on the Lord Jesus Christ, America's National Prayer Committee (NPC) exists to provide collective servant leadership to the national prayer movement. NPC was founded in 1979, and has given birth to many united prayer initiatives, both in the United States and within other nations (especially through its development of the International Prayer Assembly). Like the Mission America Coalition, the NPC actually began as a subcommittee on prayer at the first Lausanne International Congress on World Evangelization held in Switzerland. The NPC fosters a number of projects including the Taskforce on Theological Education, Pray! Magazine, the Denominational Prayer Leaders Network, and others.

MAC Connects National Movements with Local Leaders

Working with gospel leaders in hundreds of cities for nearly two decades, the Mission America Coalition (MAC) has helped to serve and partner with cities by connecting national ministry efforts such as:

- **Loving Our Communities to Christ:** a score of cities, hundreds of congregations, thousands of believers writing tens of thousands of names on prayer walls; Christians praying, caring and sharing Jesus with friends and family in their neighborhoods and workplaces.
- **Movement Day in NYC** catalyzing gospel movements in hundreds of cities.
- **“Ready Church Group Training”** connecting cities to training offered by the Christian Emergency Network
- **“Hope Sunday Campaigns”** sponsoring 1000 orphans and vulnerable children on a single day through World Vision
- **“Uncover the Word”** a 10-year scripture engagement campaign in the top 200 major cities with the American Bible Society.
- **The Fallen but Not Forgotten** — MAC was catalytic in introducing this 9/11 follow-up booklet from one partner ministry to 20 leaders in a crowded caucus room, resulting in 10 million pieces distributed.
- **9/11 Remembrance** — More than 25,000 churches took part nationwide.
- **Lighthouses of America** — at its height, some 1,000,000 lighthouses were established in homes across the country representing believers from scores of denominations and ministries.
- **Celebrate Jesus 2000** brought involvement from 83 denominations, touching millions of lives.

Monthly Conference Calls Link Leaders and Ideas

Cityreachers' Call

For the past dozen years, the Mission America Coalition has connected leaders and introduced them to new ideas and resources through national telephone conference calls. Grassroots leaders have expressed how their ministry benefits from sharing challenges and best practices in reaching cities and communities for Christ.

Evangelism Leaders' Call

Continuing from an Orlando 2011 affinity consultation, MAC's National Facilitator for Evangelism, Dallas Anderson, launched a monthly call for evangelism leaders. Every fourth Thursday persons passionate about evangelism are invited to a conversation about the issues facing the Church as she seeks to demonstrate and declare the love of God in Christ.

Intercessors' Call

Every Wednesday at noon, MAC's National Facilitator for Prayer, Pat Allen, hosts a weekly prayer conference call for intercessors' leaders to come together in prayer for missions and evangelism.

These teleconferences have developed into peer learning communities. The opportunity to listen, question, and share opinion transforms a scattered-across-the-nation group of diverse people into a Spirit-filled community of fellow travelers on the journey to fulfilling the Great Commission.

Loving Our Communities to Christ Launches “LC2C 3.0”

Prayer-Care-Share Resources Available to Cities Nationwide

Loving Our Communities to Christ (LC2C) offers a framework for culture change within the Church by incorporating the prayer-care-share lifestyle into the mindset of each church family, ministry and activity—equipping believers to intercede for lost persons by name and need, express the love of Christ in tangible acts of compassion (holistic evangelism), and explain the gospel as the Holy Spirit presents opportunities.

As each participating city has customized this foundational concept, several key components have surfaced: the primacy of a Love Commitment to love our neighbors, the call to deploy prayer-care-share Lifestyle Christians, the strategic need to expand and extend Leadership Connections across the city (pastors and marketplace leadership), and the need to provide Learning Communities for those leaders to pray and dialog together. These insights, resources, tools, and a growing number of coaching specialists are now available to serve collaborative city movements across the nation as “LC2C 3.0.”

The city/community transformation movement is maturing and accelerating. City Impact Roundtables are increasing. Movement Day is exploding. Coaching is emerging. City-focused books and strategic action plans are widespread. The LC2C framework enables a collaborative movement to catalyze grassroots, deed-and-word witness in its communities. Its components allow for a wide variety of MAC ministry partners to serve better together.

LC2C 3.0 Resources

- **Catalog:** An expanding list of tools produced by the LC2C team of coaches is available online to serve any citywide movement: Resources for implementing the vision, engaging leaders into the process, designing strategic lead team meetings, assessing progress, and more.
- **Clinic:** Live teleconferences and podcasts of themes and topics, questions and concerns, relevant to a citywide movement by the LC2C coaches, national City Impact Roundtable leaders, and community transformation authors are also available online.
- **Coaching:** Personal help for city movements who want to commit to this initiative is available through online and onsite coaching from an expanding team of coaches and ministry specialists.

Prayer Walkers Remind Their City God Cares
Members of Warehouse Church and other Aurora, Ill.-area churches walked 10 miles across the city, and stopped at 14 different places to pray for residents during the 59th National Day of Prayer. “The prayers of God’s people played a part in bringing the violent crime rate and the suicide rate down in Aurora,” said Randy Schoof, pastor at Warehouse Church and one of the organizers of Aurora’s Prayer Walk. “This is our way to remind Aurora that God cares.” Aurora is in the Fox Valley, a Loving Our Communities to Christ partner region.

La Red Trains for Next Generation in Proverbs Principles
A Marketplace Prayer Summit was held in Thomasville, Ga., with keynote speaker Dr. Jerry Anderson, CEO of La Red Business Network. La Red focuses on teaching biblical principles of character to business people worldwide. “We have been praying for years for God to transform our community and society and now it seems He is offering us a “tool” at no cost except time to begin to train young people and others the character traits and principles that lead to God’s favor and blessing,” reports Doug Silva, one of the Thomasville city leaders. Thomasville is one of MAC’s Loving Our Communities to Christ partner cities.

Leaders Discuss Prayer-Care-Share in Arizona
In preparation for a City Impact Roundtable to be held in Arizona Spring 2012, a group of more than 70 ministry, church, and government leaders gathered recently to pray and brainstorm about opportunities and needs in the state of Arizona. MAC’s John Quam and Phil Miglioratti helped facilitate the dialog and discussion of Loving Our Communities to Christ, a framework for grass roots strategies in collaborative evangelism, and the prayer-care-share approach to evangelism.

State Facilitators Advance the Prayer-Care-Share Model

MAC has begun a prayerful process of recruiting State Facilitators who will serve local prayer-care-share efforts in cities and communities throughout their states. We trust God to have 20 state facilitators by the end of 2012, and one in every state by 2014. We are committed to a servant-leadership contact and resource through our state facilitators in advancing the prayer-care-share lifestyle.

Prayer-Care-Share Cityreaching Underway in Texas

God is active and moving in new and recently established cityreaching movements throughout Texas. In Houston a new cityreaching effort is involving churches in adopting apartment complexes in disadvantaged neighborhoods. In the Dallas metroplex, Unite the Church, is bringing churches together in service projects throughout the city. In McKinney, local churches are adopting Title 1 schools and providing for the needs of the community through “Clothe a Child” and “Garage Giveaway.” Recently an Ignite Greater Works conference in Dallas gathered city ministries together. These ministries serving on the frontlines need more partnership from the “whole Church.”

For nearly two decades, the Mission America Coalition has connected, resourced and empowered over 2500 gospel leaders in over 250 city movements. Our vision is to have effective cityreaching movements by year 2020 in 2600 cities in the U.S. with a population of more than 10,000. As we reach the U.S., we are evangelizing and discipling current and future influence-leaders who have come to the U.S. from unreached people groups around the world. Many of these new gospel leaders are

returning to their countries equipped for fruitful evangelism. God is working in mighty ways by His Spirit through the Body of Christ to reach and transform U.S. and global cities!

One of the key ways we equip cityreachers and city and community leaders is through City Impact Roundtables (CIR) — peer to peer learning communities of thought-leading practitioners. CIRs have been hosted around the nation for 12 years and have fueled significant cityreaching and community transformation efforts. In 2012, MAC plans to host six regional CIRs. By 2014, we plan to convene a CIR in the top 250 cities in the same two-day period. Many gospel leaders across America credit the CIRs with fanning the flame for many of the collaborative cityreaching movements!

Ministry Networks Unite Christians in Common Affinity Groups

Many strategic ministry networks in the U.S. have been formed or strengthened as a result of the Mission America Coalition. These autonomous networks provide strategic opportunities for collaborative evangelism and discipleship. MAC continues to serve as an environment for connection, communication, and encouragement. A few of the newer developing ministry networks are in areas of apologetics, marketplace/workplace, and children's ministries. **The National Apologetics and Biblical Worldview Network** is a recognition of multiple collaborations in social networking, conferences, and resource providers. **The Workplace & Leadership Ministry Network** is facilitating collaboration among marketplace and workplace leaders in U.S. cities. **The 4-14 Movement** is a growing collaboration of children's ministries to recognize and act on the strategic importance and potential of children and youth aged 4 to 14 for the gospel. The Lausanne Global Conversation online offers a wide range of topics related to world evangelization and ways to connect with others involved in those issues. Lausanne offers a free, monthly e-newsletter, the Lausanne Connecting Point, and a monthly, online magazine Lausanne World Pulse. The magazine offers missions and evangelism news, information and analysis from leaders around the world.




